



Travelling a millennium in one performance might seem like a bit of a challenge, but Saltarello Trio manage it with gusto. This musical journey, presented by Garth Knox, Sylvain Lemêtre and Agnès Vesterman, somehow traces a clear musical line from Hildegard Von Bingen to David Fennessy, stopping along the way to admire the work of Dowland, Vivaldi and Purcell, not to mention an extraordinary arrangement of the folk song *Black is the Colour*, entitled *Black Brittany*.

No strangers to Irish audiences, the three members of Saltarello have been trailblazing the world of classical and contemporary music for years. For this outing they soak-up the colours and textures of folk music to hatch arrangements full of wit and feeling. They highlight connections and similarities that exist between century-wide soundworlds, and present it in an immensely enjoyable programme.

The trio's gorgeous swirling string lines and razor-sharp percussion helps reimagine old music, proving a good tune speaks to us all, regardless of language, no matter the age. Come along and experience this odyssey of sound and time.



Come and enjoy a visual and aural experience of the Causeway Coast. This captivating photographic and sonic installation, The Coleraine Citizens' Wallpaper, documents the natural phenomena and living communities of this spectacular area. It involves citizens' journalism, photojournalism and sound art to document contemporary life in areas across the north of Ulster from Inishowen to the Giants Causeway.

When completed in 2022 there will be a province-wide tapestry that involves community participants in the creation of a large-scale innovative artistic work that will feature a 65-metre-long canvas that reflects contemporary culture, tradition, citizenship and identity from the Atlantic Ocean to the Irish Sea called the Citizens' Wallpaper (that will include the Coleraine Canvases). The exhibition is produced by APAC association (Associated Photojournalism for Art & Culture).

BIG TELLY - OUR RESIDENT THEATRE COMPANY

Big Telly, Northern Ireland's longest established professional theatre company, is based at Flowerfield Arts Centre.

From our base here at Flowerfield, we are continually exploring new ways and new places to engage people with performance. In October, 'The Worst Café in the World' sold out at the Belfast International Arts Festival. A devised show set in an empty shop in the Cathedral Quarter, Worst Café transformed the space to the delight of audiences. Worst Cafe tours in March 2020.

As well as our national focus, we are committed to an annual programme of

creative activity in the Causeway Coast and Glens area.

We collaborated in CC&GBC's 'Sea Gods, Shipwrecks and Sidhe Folk' tourism and heritage project commissioning NI writers to create eight original pieces of work about specific sites in the borough, which will feature in a new tourism app for visitors.

We will premiere a unique new show with chef Paula McIntyre at Flowerfield in February, celebrating the work of Seamus Heaney, bringing together theatre and food.

We're launching a new project with 'Hummingbird Project NI focusing on local at-risk young people, using



music and creative writing to develop confidence and self-expression.

Our Halifax Foundation funded Windows project will work with older members of the community to lead on skills sharing and creative sessions, and the flagship 'Creative Shops' programme will be running shops in the Causeway Coast area, with a special shop happening in Ballycastle in February 20, working with Ballycastle Museum and exploring the towns heritage with the community at the centre of the project.

We delivered three of our much-loved Bear Hospitals in Roe Valley, Flowerfield and Ballymoney.

We very proud to be the only NI host organisation for the national Fun Palaces campaign, extending its reach to our local communities. www.funpalaces.co.uk for the next 3 years.

2019 was a whirlwind and 2020 is again set to be a busy and creative year.
