DISRUPTIVE WOMEN / **MUJERES** DISRUPTIVAS



Conflict Textiles 1 April - 5 August

Mujeres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women brings together many threads of connection. It marks the 15th anniversary of Conflict Textiles inaugural exhibition The Politics of Chilean Arpilleras (2008). It builds on a ten year plus collaborative relationship with Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc which has progressed from exhibiting each other's textiles to cocurated exhibitions such as Childrens Rights. Derechosdel Niño. Dretsdels Infants (2020-21). Mujeres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women is the second co-curated exhibition and adds a new dimension to the Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc exhibition Muieres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women (Badalona, 2019).

Through a selection of arpilleras from the Conflict Textiles and Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc collection, we are introduced to disruptive women worldwide: women who have pushed the boundaries of societal expectations of women: women who have broken the mould: women who have challenged and denounced violence and human rights abuses; women who have

supported each other in their demands for justice and fairness. Above all, this exhibition nudges us to consider our preconceived ideas of disruption.

The exhibition takes place across three venues:

- Flowerfield Arts Centre, the venue 3 for Arpilleras that Crv Out (2009) will feature the bulk of the exhibition.
- A number of pieces will also be displayed within two permanent rotating exhibition spaces; Conflict **Textiles collection: Magee Campus** Library, Ulster University; and
- > The Troubles and Beyond in Ulster Museum.

After gracing our virtual Northern Lights Sessions during lockdown, we are delighted to welcome ARBORIST to our auditorium for what promises to be an extraordinary evening with their full sixpiece band.

In March 2022, Mark McCambridge embarked on a solo trip to Spacebomb Studios in Richmond, Virginia to record the third ARBORIST album. Working alongside Matthew E White (Producer) and recording with the legendary Spacebomb House Band they completed what has become 'An Endless Sequence of Dead Zeros', set to be released on Kirkinriola Records in April 2023.

Belfast native Mark McCambridge played his first show as ARBORIST supporting James Yorkston. A solo tour followed before impressive performances led to notable support slots alongside Low, Cat Power, Echo and The Bunnymen and Guy Garvey. They came to the attention of critics with their debut single 'Twisted Arrow,' which features an astonishing duet with Kim Deal of The Breeders.

Their debut album 'Home Burial' (2016) and the follow-up 'A Northern View' both received glowing praise from the likes of The Guardian ("instant classic. $\star \star \star \star$ ") MOJO ("...devastatingly bleak...upliftingly beautiful. $\star \star \star \star$ ") and Uncut 8/10.

A sold-out tour in Oct/Nov 2022 alongside Americana high-flyers The Delines is followed-up with a full-band UK and Ireland tour in 2023.

5-WEEK THROWING COURSE FOR BEGINNERS & **IMPROVERS**

This popular course is available across a range of dates and times throughout the season. Advance booking is recommended as places fill up fast!

This five-week throwing course will teach you the basics of throwing on the pottery wheel including centering, opening out and pulling up which you will be able to use to create a variety of different pots, including mugs and bowls, made from stoneware clay. You will also learn turning techniques to finish your pots off and to add finer details such as handles and feet. In the last week, you'll add colour to your pots using a variety of slips. Fiona will fire and glaze each item for collection at a later date. Please bring apron and wear clothes that you won't mind getting a little messy. It is advisable to cut your nails short for this class.

Specifically designed for beginners, you will create your own range of hand-built ceramics using stoneware clay, learning how to hand roll, form and decorate a range of pots suitable for a beautiful summer table. You can choose to create one of your own unique ceramic centrepieces (plate or cake stand or cheese board) as well as a couple of mini pots which will then be fired and glazed for you, to be collected at a later date. Perfect for some home baked treats and tea on a Summer afternoon. Please wear clothes that you don't mind getting dirty and bring an apron.



FUSED GLASS: HEART COLLAGE

Wednesday 24 May • 2-4pm Cost: £36 full. £32 concession (includes all materials)

In this half-day workshop with artist Natasha Duddy, participants will focus on the creation of at least 12 individually designed fused glass pieces brought together to create a heart collage. All work will be fired in a kiln and ready for collection within 14 days of the workshop. No experience required. Please note. participants must wear close-toed shoes.



CONTEMPORARY STILL LIFE PAINTING Thursday 25 May & 1 June • 7-9pm • Cost: £30 full, £27 concession

Explore the practice of still life painting which celebrates ordinary everyday objects with Heather Byrne. This genre of painting goes back centuries, but Heather will help you use it in a contemporary way, with drawing exercises that encourage you to be expressive and intuitive. Participants will look at composition, colour mixing and working in a series, which you will be able to develop in the second workshop to create a finished painting.

Please bring two or three small everyday objects – for example, a piece of fruit, cup, spoon, pencil, book, small jug, flower, feather. Choose objects that give you colour, shape or an interesting pattern. Please also bring an A3 sketchbook and a good selection of acrylic paint and drawing materials (charcoal, oil pastels, soft pastels, drawing pencils or felt tip pens). Please wear a shirt or an apron, that you won't mind getting marked with paint.

FUSED GLASS: BUTTERFLIES & BEES

Thursday 25 May • 7-9pm Cost: £32 full, £30 concession

Participants will design and assemble two butterflies and bees to hang or to frame. Led by artist E-J McCartney, you'll learn how to cut and assemble glass in a number of forms (sheet glass, frit, stringers and confetti). All work will be fired in a kiln and ready for collection within 14 days of the workshop. No experience required. Please note, participants must wear close-toed shoes.

PERSPECTIVES OF PAINTING

Saturday 27 May 11am-1.30pm Cost: £22 full, £20 concession (includes all materials)

With guidance from artist Elaine Harkness, you'll learn how to apply the rules of perspectives to all subjects, whether it's a landscape, seascape, still life, interior scene, portrait, or figure painting. The class will also look at how to add figures into cityscapes and landscapes. No experience is necessary.







PAINT THE COAST IN OILS Thursday 1 & 8 June 10am-12.30pm Cost: £40 full, £36 concession

Join artist Elaine Harkness in this two-part workshop series to explore colour mixing, mark making and how oil paint can be built up in layers. Create a beautiful fish mobile in soft tonal colours with harmonious movement, perfect for hanging indoor or out. You will be taught glass techniques by experienced glass artist Natasha Duddy, including glass cutting skills, combining glass frits and stringers to achieve your colour patterns. All work will be fired in a kiln and ready for collection within 14 days of the workshop. No experience required. Please note, participants must wear close-toed shoes.



LANDSCAPE SKETCHBOOKS at East Strand, Portrush Saturday 17 June 10.30am-1pm Cost: £25 full, £23 concession

As summer approaches, it's great to get outside and develop a sketchbook and painting practice. This outdoor session at Portrush's beautiful East Strand beach offers some great viewpoints and will give you a chance to take inspiration directly from our coastline.
