Presented by the Education Authority Autism Advisory and Intervention Service (AAIS) this exhibition features over 100 pieces of artwork by autistic pupils from post-Primary schools throughout Northern Ireland. Aiming to empower our autistic young people, showcase their incredible creative talents, listen to their voices and enabling the wider community to learn more about autism, this exhibition offers invaluable insight and is not to be missed!

DISRUPTIVE WOMEN / **MUJERES DISRUPTIVAS**

Conflict Textiles 8 February - 5 August (Upper Gallery)

Mujeres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women brings together many threads of connection. It marks the 15th anniversary of Conflict Textiles inaugural exhibition The Politics of Chilean Arpilleras (2008). It builds on a ten year plus collaborative relationship with Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc which has progressed from exhibiting each other's textiles to cocurated exhibitions such as Childrens Rights, Derechosdel Niño, Dretsdels Infants (2020-21). Mujeres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women is the second co-curated exhibition and adds a new dimension to the Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc exhibition Mujeres Disruptivas / Disruptive Women (Badalona, 2019).

Through a selection of arpilleras from the Conflict Textiles and Fundació Ateneu Sant Roc collection, we are introduced to disruptive women worldwide: women who have pushed the boundaries of societal expectations of women; women who have broken the mould; women who have challenged and denounced violence and human rights abuses:

women who have supported each other in their demands for justice and fairness. Above all, this exhibition nudges us to consider our preconceived ideas of disruption.


The exhibition takes place across three venues:

UNGERTAIN LANDSGAPES

ALEX DEWART & HEATHER MCATEER 18 February - 25 March

ARTIST TALK: with Alex Dewart & Heather McAteer, Saturday 18 February at 11:30am. Free but booking essential.

EXHIBITION LAUNCH: Please join us on Saturday 18 February at 1pm. All welcome.

Heather McAteer and Alex Dewart are contemporary artists, raised in Northern Ireland, but now based in the south of England. Their birthplace continues to inform their work.

As a teenager in 1970s County Antrim, Dewart has experienced the dramatic beauty of the landscape, and the fearfilled Troubles. Her artworks reflect

that dichotomy; exploring landscapes physical and metaphorical – that entice and trouble with vivid colour, gesture and pattern.

Similarly, McAteer spent her teenage years in 1980s Belfast. Her work draws on life on a housing estate, built on top of former parkland. Her window overlooked an untouched wood – the allure and fear evoked by this mysterious territory are tied to her desire for autonomy during the turbulence of the conflict. Using graphite tonalities, she creates a psychological darkness, depicting unpopulated spaces infused with melancholic absence.

In their different ways the artists use composition to communicate distance and alienation. Their works depict lonely landscapes and windowless, unwelcoming houses. Landscapes are never benign. They entwine with beauty in our minds but hold an unsettling undercurrent of difficult histories. They are the site of precarious balance between humans and nature, and the works inhabit this uneasy space between natural and manmade, imaginary and real.

ULTAN O'BRIEN & NIC GAREISS

Friday 10 February, 7:30pm Tickets £10 full, £9 concession

Fiddler, violist, and composer Ultan O'Brien (Slow Moving Clouds) and percussive dancer Nic Gareiss (This is How we Fly) perform a set of new collaborations exploring space, time, and texture in Irish traditional music and percussive dance. Ultan and Nic create sound and movement at the nexus of sight, sound, and touch, puckishly exploring what fiddle music and step dance reveal about both predetermined and extemporaneous composition.

By engaging mimetically: fiddle, fiddler, and fiddling, dance, dancer, and dancing, the duo reimagines the erotic symbiosis of traditional music and dance through historic repertoire and new encounter via the mediums of sound and gesture.

Ultan O'Brien & Nic Gareiss' 2023 appearances resume the duo's decadelong commitment to discovering and deepening a lexicon of collaboration which, among other revelations, reconsiders movers as soundmakers and recasts fiddlers as dancers, not only as a means to highlight these respective practices and repertoires, but ultimately to centre rapport.



FILM YEAR OF LIVING **MINDFULLY**

Overwhelmed with insomnia and an incurable autoimmune disease. Shannon Harvey needed to make a change. But while the award-winning health journalist found plenty of recommendations on diet, sleep and exercise, when she looked for the equivalent of a 30-minute workout for her mental wellbeing, there was nothing.

Worried for the future mental health of her kids who were growing up amidst epidemics of stress, anxiety, depression and addiction, in a worldfirst experiment. Shannon recruited

meditation to the test. But after a 30,000-kilometre journey from the bright lights of Manhattan to the dusty refugee camps of the Middle East, what begins as a self-experiment, transforms into a life-changing experience.



8-WEEK PHOTOGRAPHY COURSE FOR BEGINNERS (via ZOOM) • Cost: £75 full, £68 concession

This online course is available across a range of dates throughout the season:

Wednesday 11 January – 1 March, 11am-1pm (Series 1)

Thursday 12 January – 2 March, 7-9pm (Series 2)

Delivered by Mathieu Decodts, this course is aimed at those new to photography or who want to improve skills. If you are an absolute beginner, you can bring your camera manual too. You will learn all about ISO, shutter speed and aperture, also known as the exposure triangle. This is the core of understanding the technical elements of



photography. As the lessons will be practical in nature, you will need a camera with the ability to change between Programme, Aperture, Shutter and Manual mode, like a DSLR, bridge or mirrorless camera. Phones are fine too but only if you can set the shutter, aperture and ISO independently. Just ask if you need help working this out. You will also need a 'can do' attitude and a desire to improve as each week we will learn and practice together. The lessons will be tailored to the needs of the group, but above all, they will be entertaining, thought-provoking and fun!

ART OF PORTRAIT: CHARCOAL DRAWING FOR BEGINNERS

Led by Ceramic Artist Fiona Shannon, this five-week throwing course will teach you the basics of throwing on the pottery wheel including centering, opening out and pulling up, which you will use to create a variety of different pots, including mugs and bowls. You will also learn turning techniques to finish your pots off and techniques to add finer details such as handles and feet. In the last week we will spend the evening adding colour to your pots using a variety of slips. Each participant can use up to two bags of stoneware clay to make items that will be fired and glazed by the tutor to be collected at a later date. *Please bring apron and wear clothes that you won't mind getting a little messy.*

IT'S ALL IN THE MIND! HOW YOUR THINKING AFFECTS YOUR LIFE Saturday 18 February • 10am-4:30pm • Cost: £25



Dr Maria Kee is a former consultant Psychiatrist and Cognitive Behaviour Therapist who left the NHS after over 20 years, to focus on studying and delivering training in the field of positive psychology. • COASTAL LANDSCAPES: RUNKERRY BEACH, PORTBALLINTRAE

Saturday 4 March 10:30am-1pm Cost: £25 full, £23 concession per day

A drawing trip to Runkerry Beach, Portballintrae (weather permitting) will provide the setting to work directly from nature with a focus on how to suggest mood and a sense of place rather than a perfect drawing. You will explore various mixed mediums in monotone and colour,

to produce sketches which can be developed in this series of workshops. You will become more confident using your sketchbook (A4, A5 or A3 on at least 140gms paper) as a personal visual diarv using different drawing techniques and exercises. Please bring all your studies made outside to use in the other two workshops in the studio. If weather does not permit the beach trip, you will work from views at Flowerfield, using the same techniques. Please bring drawing and painting materials that are easily carried. You will be walking and sitting to sketch outdoors so outdoor clothes and footwear and a reasonable level of fitness are required.

2 COASTAL LANDSCAPES: MONO-PRINTING

Saturday 11 March • 10:30am-1pm Cost: £25 full, £23 concession per day

Learn the easy method of mono-printing to explore the landscape, creating your own prints without using a printing press. Bring along a drawing or photograph of a landscape to develop using your own expressive style.

Please wear a shirt or an apron, that you won't mind getting marked with paint.



3 COASTAL LANDSCAPES: COLOUR COLLAGE

Saturday 18 March • 10:30am-1pm Cost: £25 full, £23 concession per day



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Use the fun process of collage combined with mark making to explore the landscape. 'Drawing with scissors', you'll experiment with collage and painting techniques, exploring the work of other artists who use collage, to create your own unique works. Bring along some found natural objects (e.g. leaves, shells, twigs, feathers) to inspire and use, a sketchbook, some loose A4 cartridge paper, acrylic paint and different sized brushes, pencils, charcoal, crayons, scissors and Pritt stick. Please wear a shirt or an apron, that you won't mind getting marked with paint.



SPRING-INSPIRED OIL PAINTING

The painting illustrates an array of colourful flowers, uprising positive emotions within the piece. You will explore colour mixing and oil painting techniques to create a painting on wood panel. *Please wear a shirt or an apron, that you won't mind getting marked with paint.*

PHOTOGRAPHY MASTERCLASS: SEEING IN BLACK & WHITE

If you are interested in black and white photography but don't know how to start or are already working in black and white but want to improve, then this is the class for you. Led by Mathieu Decodts, the focus of this masterclass is learning how to 'see in black and white.' Many modern cameras can be set to display black and white on the rear screen during use. However, learning how to recognise good compositional elements, scenes or light is the real skill in black and white photography. The four hours of practical exercises and walkabout photography aims to show you how to see interesting subjects for black and white photography before you even pick up your camera.

With lots of practical exercises you will learn about how colour theory, shapes, texture and contrast impact black and white photos and more. We will also discuss post-processing during the hour-long sit-down lunch break. Please bring a packed lunch and your mobile phone or any type of camera (even an old film one).


