Belfast is the highly acclaimed 2021 coming-of-age film written and directed by Kenneth Branagh. Starring Caitríona Balfe, Judi Dench, Jamie Dornan, Ciarán Hinds, Colin Morgan and Jude Hill, the film follows a young boy's childhood in Belfast City at the beginning of 'The Troubles' in 1969. Based on true story events from Branagh's childhood, the film won an Oscar for Best Original Screenplay in 2022 having seven nominations in total and a BAFTA for Outstanding British Film of the Yeard.

THE GOOD FRIDAY AGREEMENT – THE END OF THE BEGINNING?

A talk by Professor Paul Arthur



Light refreshments on arrival followed by guided tour of the exhibition and Professor Arthur's talk.

The vast bulk of peace agreements have a relatively short shelf life. This talk will examine the Good Friday Agreement in this context by exploring the cultural and political context in which it was signed; the fault lines that have emerged in the past 25 years; and the onward journey towards reconciliation. In that latter respect emphasis will be placed on the (negative) role of memory and the healing potential of the arts.

Professor Arthur is Emeritus Professor of Politics at Ulster University, founder and former director of the graduate program in Peace and Conflict Studies, and an honorary professor at INCORE. He was chair of Northern Ireland's 50th Anniversary Civil Rights Commemoration Committee and is a Board member of the John and Pat Hume Foundation. He is also the author of five books, including *Special Relationships: Britain, Ireland and the Northern Ireland problem (2001)* – and approximately seventy peer-reviewed articles.
